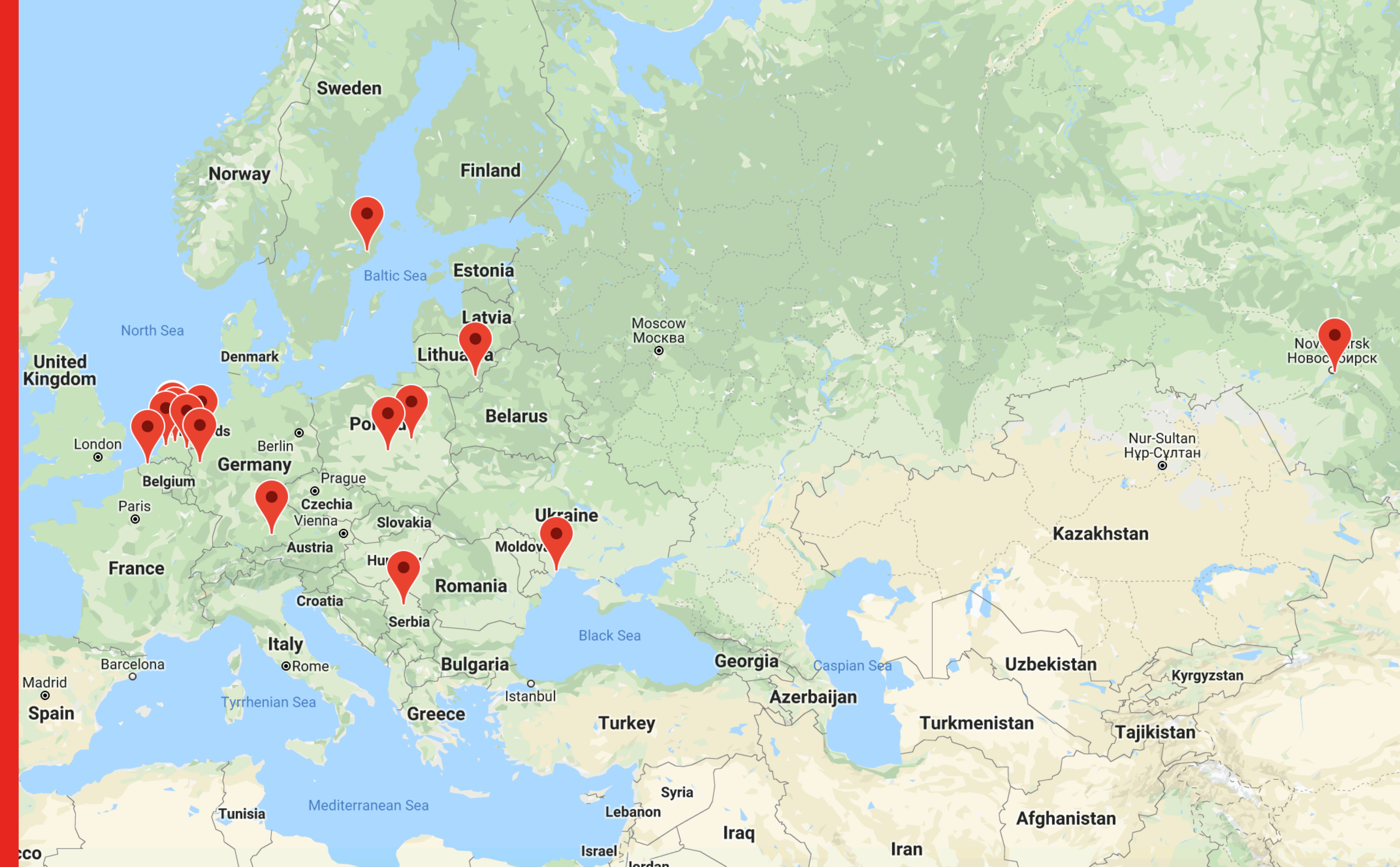

As a conference organizer, I continue to be amazed at how many people ask for airfare and hotel accommodations for a 50-minute talk (newbies and professionals alike).

Here is some advice from a conference organizer and industry speaker:

1. Don't ask us for travel fees unless you are a keynote
2. Do thank us for being selected as a speaker
3. Don't tell us we are cheap because of our travel policy
4. Do attend as much of the conference, as possible
5. Don't change your talk after being accepted

9. Don't tell us you have a special message (we all do)

10. Do understand when organizers lose patience

It is a privilege to speak at a conference. You should be humbled and honored by it. Check your ego at the door.

Never forget, we have other speakers that will pay for the travel, work with organizers, craft their message, share their stories, express their gratitude, and show up.

I prefer to work with flexible, grateful, humble people, anyway. Just some advice from an industry speaker and conference organizer.

- Or demo with videos

Live coding

- Short and relevant
- Will fail
- Don't rely on internet access
- Code snippets
- Have back-up videos
- Or “live” code with videos



The Talk

Slides

- Very personal
- For your audience and you
- Simple or exuberant
- Special attention for code examples
- How many?

Slides: color

- Good contrast
- Background color

Slides: text

- Short
- Have tweetable sound bites
- Gender neutral
- Readable
 - large font size
 - **sans serif font**

Preparation

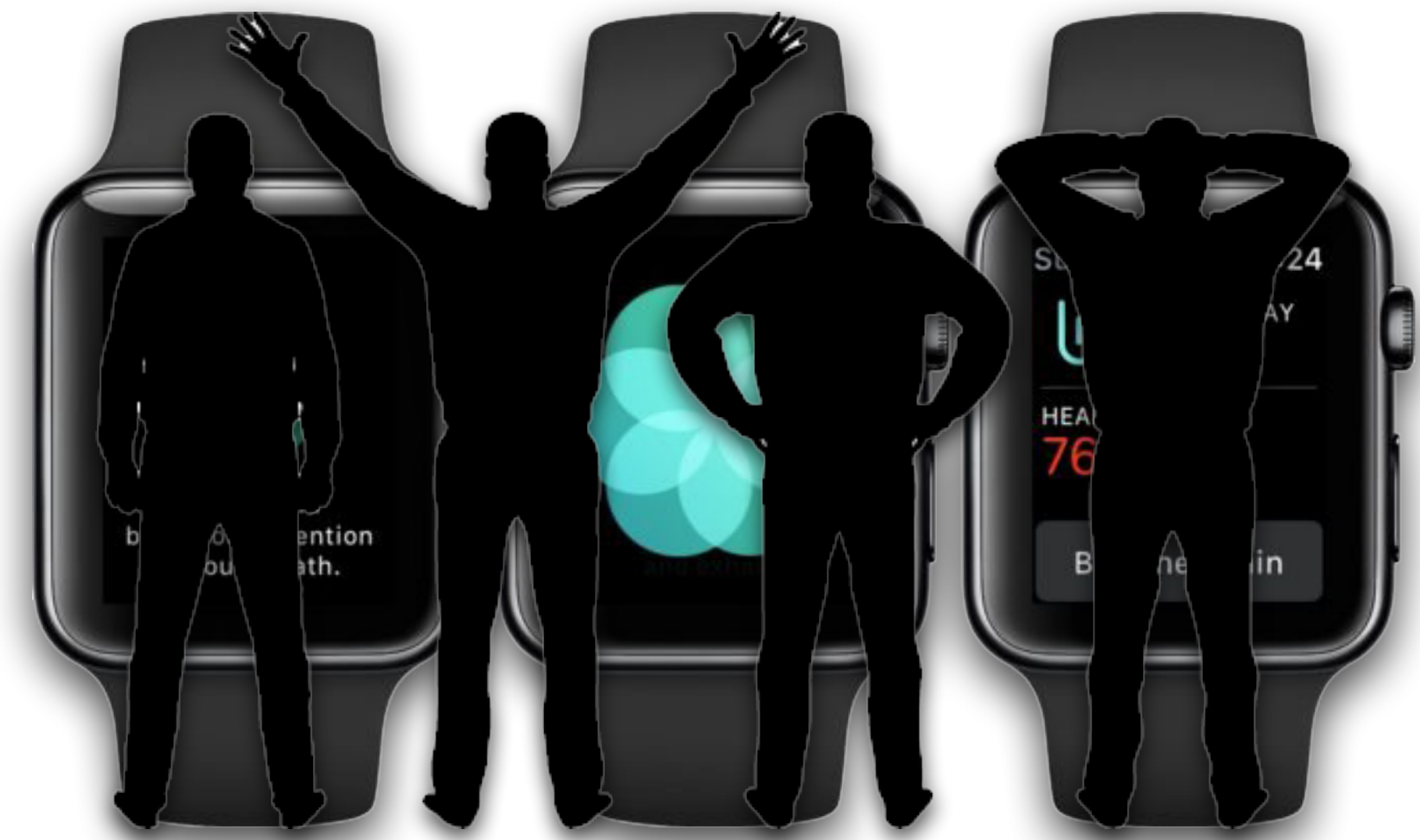
- When and where is your talk?

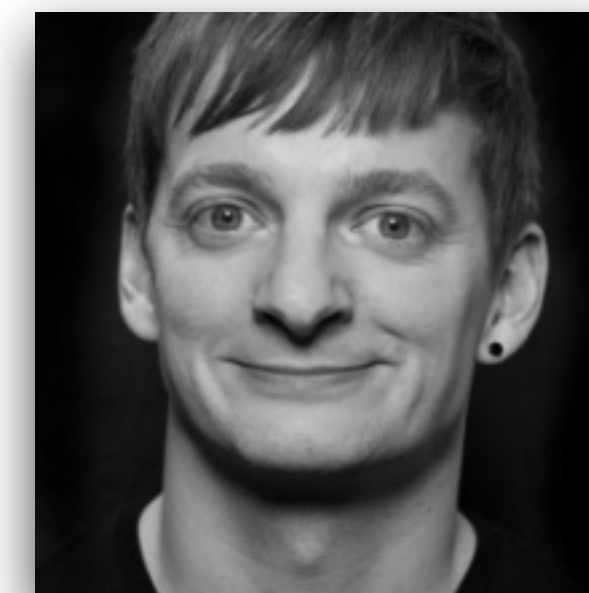

On Stage

- Nervousness
 - normal
 - shows you care
 - focus on your talk and audience
 - and breathe

On Stage

- Take time to breathe
- Shut up!
- Drink
- Look at the audience
 - Don't single someone out
 - Quiet people are focused people
 - Do people leave the room?

On Stage

- Timing
 - Know your limit!
 - Underrunning is better
 - Keep track of your time

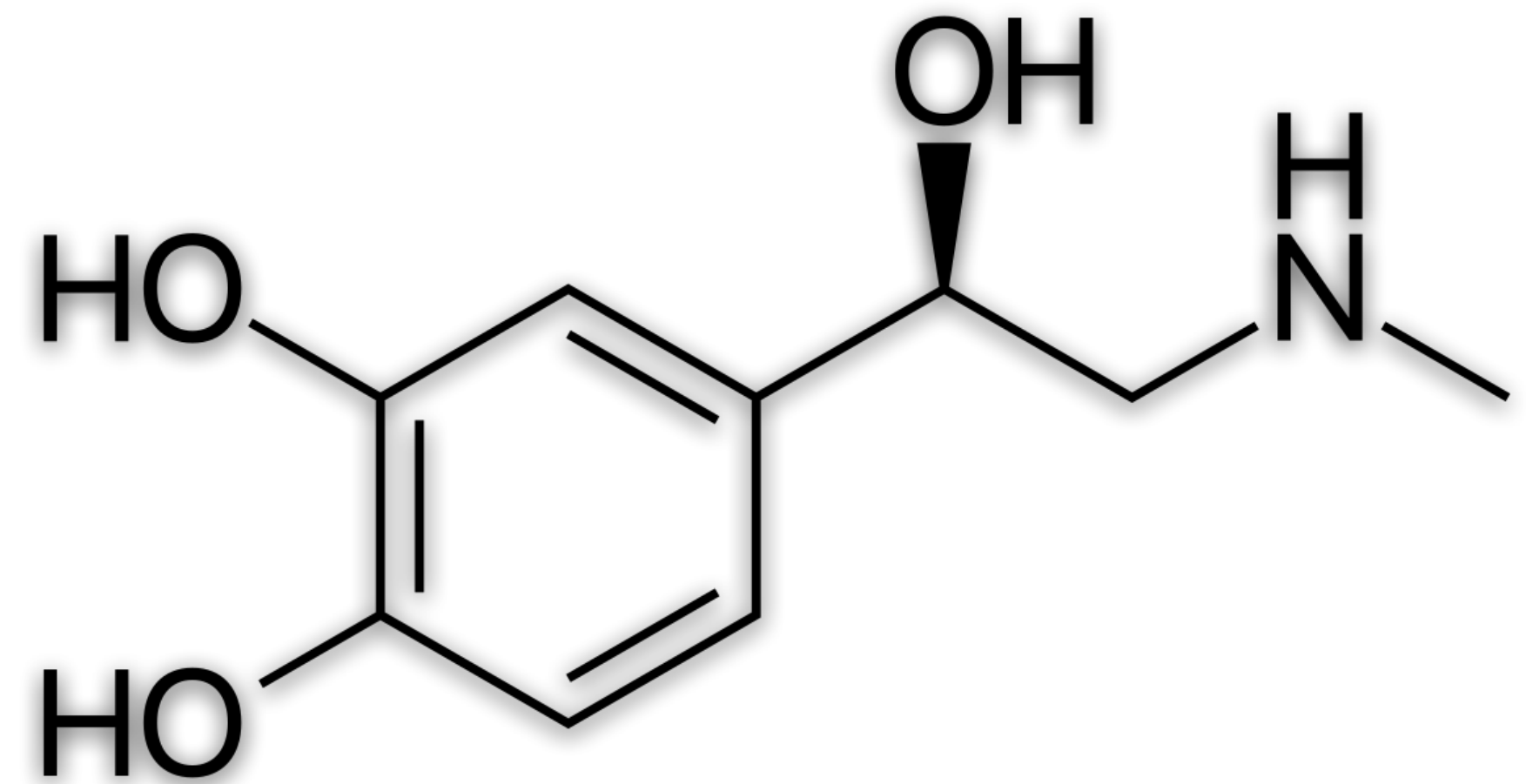
