Government Dealt Hoffa Trial Blow

CHICAGO (AP) — The government's fraud and conspiracy case against James R. Hoffa took a nose-dive Wednesday when the presiding judge told the prosecution it has yet to prove there has been any crime.

The blow to the government came after six and a half weeks of prosecution testimony and the introduction of more than 10,000 documents as evidence.

Judge Richard B. Austin of U. S. District Court, who made the statement in court, also said he would direct a verdict of acquittal on 2 of the 28 counts against Hoffa and the seven other defendants.

"There still is no evidence of any misrepresentation by any of the defendants in this lawsuit," the judge said. "Every-

Racial Cases Sent Back To City Court

BIRMINGHAM (AP) — A federal judge today refused to take jurisdiction of cases of Negroes arrested in recent Tuscaloosa demonstrations. He remanded their cases to Tuscaloosa City Court.

U. S. Dist. Judge Clarence W. Allgood ruled that Negro attorneys had failed to prove that federal court has jurisdiction over the cases.

The petition for removal of

the cases, numbering more than 80, was filed here June 11, two days after Negro demonstrators were arrested in a violent showdown with police at a church.

Allgood said that the plaintiffs had not proven that their rights had been denied by any state law or State Constitution.

Rather, he said, "it appears that the allegation refers to the application of the statutes rather

than to the statutes themselves."

Allgood said that the court is convinced that the Negroes will be given fair trials, "and that the removal and trial in state court will not take away some valuable rights which is given these defendants."

He said that Tuscaloosa city attorneys had assured him the Negroes would not be hastily tried.

The Negroes were jailed on various charges, including unlawful assembly, inducing a riot and contributing to delinquency of a minor.

Allgood heard oral arguments on the case Monday in Tuscaloosa. At that time, state and Tuscaloosa attorneys filed a cross petition in Birmingham asking that the cases be remanded to city court.

Still to be ruled on is a petition by Negroes that Tuscaloosa officials be restrained from interfering with peaceful demonstrations.

Tuscaloosa attorneys also filed a cross petition on this issue. They ask that Negroes be restrained from further demonstrations. A hearing on these petitions will be resumed July 6.

Money A Factor In Taking Cons Off Road Gangs

FLORALA, Ala. (AP) — The biggest problem standing in the way of eliminating convicts from road gangs is money, Gov. George Wallace says.

Wallace said Wednesday he has discussed the matter with members of his cabinet, but they have come up with "no immediate means of replacing the money" which the Prisons Department would lose.

The Highway Department pays the prisons \$55.90 a month for each convict, and it uses about 2,000. "The prisons have long depended heavily on the revenue," Prisons Director Frank Lee remarked.

A convicted rapist who escaped from a Scottsboro road gang has been quoted as saying he kidnaped, raped and killed her.

Tuesday, an elderly man and his wife were found slashed to death in their Enterprise home, and a pickup order went out for another Negro convict who had escaped from an Enterprise camp.

Lee said all sex offenders now are barred from doing any road work, but he said he strongly favors doing away with all convict work if a way can be worked out to replace the lost revenue.

Barring that, Wallace suggested

Hunt Continues For 3; Waters To Be Dragged

PHILADELPHIA, Miss. (AP) — Federal and state officers renewed their intensive search at daybreak today for three missing civil rights workers and planned dragging operations in several bodies of water in this east central Mississippi area.

As four mounted that the three workers would not be found alive, a Highway Patrol spokesman said searchers would check all buildings, out buildings and recent excavations.

"There is still no indication . . . no definite leads for us to go on," said Art Richardson, public information officer for the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

Grady Gilmore, public relations director for the patrol, said earlier, "It is hard to believe that three people could just be swallowed up without somebody hearing or seeing them."

The trio was last seen Sunday night.

The charred hulk of the station wagon they used was found by FBI agents in a swampy area near a lonely road late Tuesday.

Allen Dallas, sent to Mississippi to gather information for the White House on the missing workers, conferred at Jackson with Gov. Paul B. Johnson.
